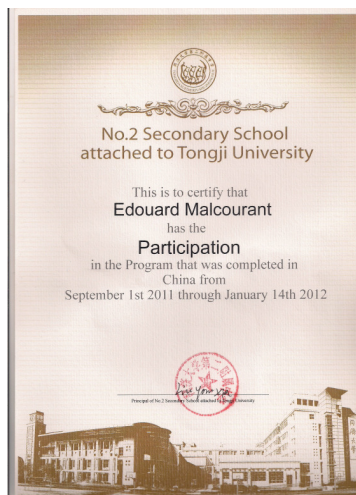
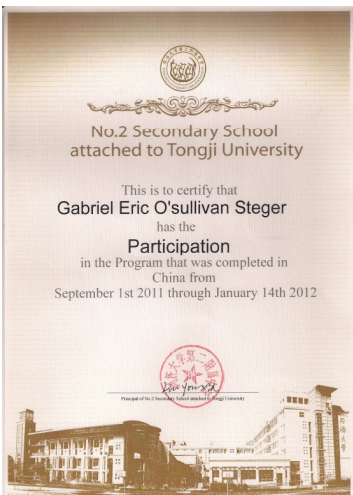
High school student graduation ceremony in Tongji No.2 middle school, 2011
